### **TODAY! Special Presentation on Moravian Heritage Sites and UNESCO, 11:15 a.m., CE-101**

This month, UNESCO will vote on whether the Moravian settlement sites of Herrnhut (Germany), Gracehill (N. Ireland), and Bethlehem (Pennsylvania) will be added to Christiansfeld (Denmark) as transnational world heritage sites. Craig Atwood, who served on the committee that drafted the proposal to UNESCO, will discuss the significance of this inscription for all Moravians.
