Throughout the summer, stewardship speakers have encouraged us to dare to be generous with our time and talent by sharing their rewarding experiences in a variety of ministries here at Home Church. October 20, Commitment Sunday, is our opportunity to dare to be generous with our financial resources. It may not be easy to take that dare because stewardship challenges us at the very edge between faith and reason.

God created us to be logical creatures who can do math, and God created us as spiritual beings who trust in God's ability to do things beyond what our minds can comprehend. When it comes to financial stewardship, it is easy to do the math: Every dollar given is one less dollar for me and my family. But God's economy does not work that way.
