PRELUDE

CALL TO WORSHIP (responsively)

O give thanks to the Lord, for God is good;

(Sitting)

Beloved, draw near to God and God will draw near to you. Let us worship and bow down, humbly confessing our sins.

Most holy and almighty God, our Savior, we confess our disobedience. We, like sheep, have gone astray, turning to our own way. We have sinned and have done wrong. The good that we knew to do we have not done. Help us, deliver us, and forgive us, we pray, for the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, who loves us and gave himself for us. Amen.

Bless and comfort us, gracious Lord and God. Amen.
