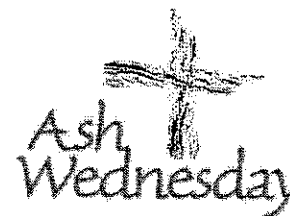
March 26, 11 AM, Advent Moravian with speaker Rev. Chris Thore. Light refreshments will be served at 10 AM. This service will be in person and online.
